FCCLA Mini Handbook a Useful Tool

To provide ongoing support to Wisconsin chapter advisers, the foundation continued with the Mini Handbook initiative. These handbooks, while "mini", provide a wealth of basic information about FCCLA. It is a useful tool which advisers and members can reference for conducting the business of the FCCLA chapter. Mini Handbooks were first distributed to the state executive council, district administrators, legislators and chapter advisers in 2015.
